- Dinner (40 people x 3hrs/1.5 weeks = 180 hrs) Y
- Coffee (Could be in coworking; 40 people x 0.5hrs/7weeks = 140 hrs) Y
- Rooftop/Terrace (40 people x 2hrs/0.4 week = 32 hrs)
- Bar (25 people x 2hrs/week = 50 hrs) N
- Cooking for common meals (3 people x 3 hrs/3 weeks = 27 hrs) - Y








- Volunteering (40 people x 1x/week 40 hrs) N


